The National Trust for Scotland now provides foreign language interpretation at over 30 of its visitor attractions across Scotland.

As well as the major European languages, Scotland's largest conservation charity now offers Chinese, Japanese and Russian translations, to ensure that as many overseas visitors as possible can enjoy each destination to the full.

- GPS audio battlefield guides in 9 languages at **Culloden** - 5 Star Visitor Attraction (IV2 5EU)
- Audio stories in 5 languages at **Glencoe** – 4 Star Visitor Attraction (PH49 4LA)
- Leaflets in 14 languages at **Crathes Castle** - 4 Star Visitor Attraction (AB31 5QJ)
- Information in 14 languages at **The Georgian House** – 4 Star Visitor Attraction (EH2 4DR)
- Room guides in 7 languages at **Culzean Castle** – 5 Star Visitor Attraction (KA19 8LE)
- Destination cards in major European languages are planned for the new **Robert Burns Birthplace Museum** (opening summer 2010) (KA7 4PQ)
