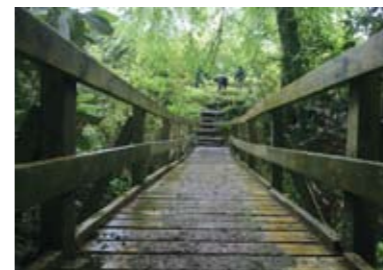


## WHAT WE CAN OFFER YOUR TEAM



### The Residential Team Challenge

The Residential Team Challenge involves a two- to five-day development experience for teams of up to 12 and is carried out on one of the Trust's countryside properties. Focusing on an essential conservation project, the Residential Team Challenge provides the setting to allow teams to learn, develop and stretch, both collectively and as individuals. Each Challenge is designed to emphasise the importance of team skills in a new and stimulating environment, and we can offer facilitated review sessions focusing on how to transfer the learning back to the workplace. All Residential Team Challenges are tailored to company needs. Each Challenge is based at Trust accommodation and all meals are provided. Accommodation can range from the superb Eisenhower Apartment at Culzean through to remote bothies on Highland estates. We can also offer a variety of skills development or outdoor activities as part of these projects, such as sea kayaking at Kintail, mountain biking at Mar Lodge or practising raku, an ancient Japanese method of firing ceramics, at Culzean.
